




The State of Housing in Pennsylvania

Solutions

- Build more affordable housing
- Provide better services to people experiencing housing insecurity
- Other strategies to reduce poverty

- ❖Increased funding to the Pennsylvania Housing and Rehbilitation and Expansion Fund (PHARE) - \$15 Million 2019 - DONE
- Create a State Housing Tax Credit to increase investment in Affordable Housing
- Create a Medicaid Waiver to use Medicaid dollars to provide supportive housing services to prevent homelessness



State Housing Tax Credit

SB 31

Economic impact of \$10 million for new construction and renovation of existing affordable housing in Pennsylvania

Direct economic impact	\$10.6 million
Indirect & induced impact	\$9.6 million
Total economic impact	\$19.6 million
Total jobs supported	110 jobs supported
Total employee compensation	\$4.5 million
